**GOOD MORNING AND WELCOME TO WORSHIP THIS DAY!** In Our Gospel today, we see that what was planned by the Pharisee and Herodians as a setback for Jesus and His ministry became a setup for Jesus to proclaim the Kingdom of God and to accomplish the very purpose for which His Heavenly Father sent Him. By Word and Sacrament today, the Holy Spirit helps us to acknowledge God the Father's authority over all things in heaven and on earth. They also give us faith to respond to the Lord in ways that honor Him as the Giver of all things, and live our lives in worship, gratitude and praise. In Jesus Christ our Lord, God the Father takes even the setbacks of life we experience and uses them for what He is going to accomplish next in our lives! Do return and worship our Creating, Redeeming and Sanctifying God with us again soon!

**HOLY COMMUNION WILL BE CELEBRATED TODAY AT THE 8:15 A.M. DIVINE WORSHIP SERVICE.** We confess that in the bread and wine we truly receive Jesus' body and blood which were given and shed for the forgiveness of our sins and for the strengthening of our faith. Fellow Lutherans and those who have communed with us before may join us at the Lord's Table. If you are uncertain as to what you receive in the Holy Supper or hold to a different confession, we ask that you speak to pastor or one of the elders **before** coming to His Holy Table. This practice is instituted to do a responsible ministry to all who come to the Holy Supper, and to ensure that the Sacrament is taken to the soul's health of each communicant.

**PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:**

- The Common Cup will not be celebrated until the epidemic passes.
- Communion will be held in CONTINUOUS FASHION only.
- The Pastor and Elders will wear masks and gloves to distribute the elements of the Lord's Supper to our people.

- The Host will be dropped into the cupped hand of each communicant.
- The individual cups will be spaced apart adequately so that cups will not be touched when communicants reach for the wine.
- Communicants will dispose of their individual cups in receptacles in the side aisles as is customary at continuous-style Communion.

**At the time of dismissal of service, we ask all worshipers to be patient.**

- Dismissal will be from the rear of the church first, with all present keeping social distancing practices in mind.
- No gathering in the Welcome Center.
- The Pastor will not be able to greet worshipers in line.
- Handshakes and hugs so plenteous in our church must be forgone until this epidemic passes.
