## God is our Keeper!

*Psalm 24:1 "The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and ALL who live in it..."*

Dear Friends in Christ,

A special report aired on one of our local television stations recently featuring a Sunday evening documentary discussing how much has changed in life in the last 18 months during the Covid Pandemic. All agree that many things have changed. A wise person, however, understands much has stayed the same! Reporters and counselors were lamenting that post-pandemic, life will never, ever be the same again. The counselor interviewed was offering supposedly helpful suggestions for families and individuals as to how one can "move forward" in what is now being called "the new normal." Many people are reporting that they are making sweeping life changes since the quarantine: leaving their jobs, relinquishing activities with others, working only from their homes, even downsizing homes and material possessions. The report positively indicated that Covid-19 has given people some time and opportunity to pause and determine what is truly important to them in their lives. Such has provided time to make some healthy changes.

We agree that God uses even the hardships of life as opportunities to strengthen us, to help us make healthy changes, and draw us closer to Him and His Son Jesus. From a Christian point of view however, what was most unsettling about this special report was the perspective from which the counselor was approaching this entire issue. What was telling is not only what she said, but what she failed to say. She was encouraging listeners to make themselves and their feelings the epicenter of their choices...even in their spiritual lives! Unsurprisingly, there was no mention in this discussion about God, His Word or His will for us and our children in our lives. When it came to talking about one's spiritual life, she counseled people to focus on what THEY WANTED for their spiritual lives. She directed parents first and foremost to ask their children what they want in their spiritual lives. In other words: "do you want to attend church anymore?" "Do you want to gather and worship and serve God with others?" "Do you want to go to Sunday School and Confirmation and learn the meaning of your baptism and the Word of God?" In a day and in an age where the personal rights of the individual worshiped above God and His Word, looking to ourselves and our personal feelings may seem a most normal and logical exercise. The problem with such counsel, however, is that it fails to take into consideration what our Changeless God and Savior says is true, healthy and beneficial for us. It fails to remind us of the responsibilities God has placed on parents to "train up their children in the way that they should go."

God's Word reminds us that because of our sinful, human nature, we and our children are most likely to take the path of least resistance in life when it comes to our walk with God. This is especially true when times become even more challenging. Looking toward our feelings may well be a mirror of what is really living in our hearts, but merely depending on our feelings and desires is a faulty guide for the person who earnestly desires

to live a healthy spiritual life. Our feelings are more than capable of leading us to places that are not necessarily healthy for us...or safe. We need to recognize the truth that when we rely on our own flawed wisdom, we will walk away from God and His Word, and we will design our lives without Him. The Bible reminds us: "There is a way *that seems* right to a man, But its end *is* the way of death." Proverbs 14:12. Our feelings can never be the primary, guiding factor as we consider what is truly healthy. We need Christ Jesus and the health that He brings and His dependable Word to guide us as we move forward, not only through these present, challenging days, but through to eternal life in heaven.

God's Wisdom, which is Jesus Christ, and God's power in the universe both abide to this day. So does His steadfast love. The Word, which proclaims His love for us, is abiding, steadfast and firm. God stands behind all of His promises, even in our changing times, and the greatest promise He has made is that "He so loved US that He gave His one and only Son, so that believing in Him, we will not perish but have eternal life." The Gospel of God's changeless love for us in Jesus is our dependable guide, giving us something sure to build upon when it seems that everything around us is changing. The "new normal" that people talk about today is NOT NORMAL AT ALL! God's truths as Jesus taught them are the sure foundation for us, and THESE PROMISES ARE THE "NORMAL" for us believers, even though we see things change right and left around us. All changes, even the present pandemic, can never destroy the foundation which God has established for us in Jesus. And JESUS is the foundation which we adults and our children need for future days.

Only God knows what will come in the days ahead. We thank Him that some of our activities in life have returned to familiar, pre-pandemic experiences, With God's help, we are moving forward day by day in our homes and here at Christ the King. As you give consideration to your spiritual life and the spiritual lives of your children, remember the firm foundation God has built for you in Jesus as a baptized believer. Move through the days ahead building on the foundation of His mercy and grace. Join us for worship, Bible Study, Confirmation, Sunday School Classes, and the multiple fellowship activities we have. God's Word and Sacraments are dependable guides for us at **all** times. While feelings have their place, be very, very careful as to how much emphasis you are placing on those feelings, because your feelings are not the all-reliable guide for your spiritual life that some are making them out to be!

# Holy Communion

We have restored the practice of Holy Communion as celebrated kneeling at our altar, and we have also restored the use of the Common Cup for those who desire it. As a matter of precaution, the pastors and elders are continuing to wear protective masks and gloves for the safe distribution of the Elements of Holy Communion. Note that extra care is being taken, cleansing the Common Cup between each participant with a purificator dampened with grain alcohol with a 75.5% alcohol content. With the gold lining in our chalice and a 12 % alcohol content in the Sacramental wine, it has been historically understood for centuries that this has provided one of the safest, sterile environments that exist for the reception of Holy Communion. This is the Lord's Table, and it is His meal which He gives us for our spiritual good. Jesus wouldn't command us to "take eat, take drink" if this were the wrong thing to do. You can be sure God is ever watching out for our welfare and safety, even in worship! As a sidenote: There has never been a known, recorded instance of disease being transmitted through the use of the Common Cup in Holy Communion. We come to the Lord's Table with faith in Him, and your leaders are practicing all diligence for your peace of mind. Come and take part in The Holy Meal, for Jesus commands "OFTEN." It is His means of grace to keep us strong in faith and healthy in our souls!

Also, for your safety - the doors of our church are monitored by our elders and ushers during every Divine Service and worship gathering. Doors remain closed during services but are monitored by our leaders.

Please be prompt in your arrival for Divine Service each Sunday. If you do happen to arrive late, entrance is possible, but please be patient. An elder will be at the door to let you in. When you enter and leave the church, please be sure the doors are latched behind you. This diligence keeps everyone safe, especially in a very public, high volume parking lot such as the one we share with Kroger next door.

# The Mystery of Stewardship

In Biblical language, a mystery is a reality so far above human understanding that it would never be known if it had not been revealed by the Holy Spirit. Even after the revelation, the mystery cannot be accepted or acted upon without the Spirit's aid. Through faith, we can understand the mystery, and we can act upon it as well as experience its promises. Without faith, it will remain hidden.

Faith opens the door to this mystery of stewardship. Through faith, we understand that this mystery or even miracle of stewardship is that the more we give, the more we will receive. In our human understanding, this sounds impossible. How can we have more by giving away what we have? Yet this is precisely what the power of God makes possible. God promises blessings to those who give faithfully. Jesus said, Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you" (Luke 6:38). Jesus promises that as we give, we will receive. When we honor God with our wealth and possessions, God will bless us. The blessings we receive through our giving may not always come back to us in kind. We may receive financial blessings, but our greatest blessings will be spiritual because we know God's gifts to us are far better than our gifts to Him.

In 2 Corinthians chapters 8 and 9, we read about Paul seeking a collection from the people in Corinth for the distressed Christians in Jerusalem, He promises them a true and full life for their generosity when he writes:

"The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully" (2 Corinthians 9:6). When we give much, we will receive much. Solomon expressed the principle of sowing and reaping in these words: "One gives freely, yet grows all the richer; another withholds what he should give, and only suffers want. Whoever brings blessing will be enriched, and one who waters will himself be watered" (Proverbs 11:24-25). He also wrote, "Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord, and He will repay him for his deed" (Proverbs 19:17). God has ordained that, when we give generously, we receive generously.

Through this wonderful mystery of stewardship, we can place our trust in the Lord and experience His promise to bless our faithful generosity. When we learn to place our whole weight upon God's promises, we will begin to experience the mystery at work in our lives. Always remember that God's power backs His promises. May we all experience the joy of giving generously.

## Our Fall Schedule

With the unknowns of Covid-19 and the difficulty of our students returning to public school in Grosse Pointe this September and with some families still traveling in the earlier part of the month, we are holding off the beginning of Sunday School and our Adult Sunday Bible Class program until September 26<sup>th</sup>, which will be our "Rally Sunday" this year.

**SUNDAY SCHOOL WILL BEGIN** Sunday, September 26<sup>th</sup> and will be held each Sunday from 10:45 -11:45 during our 10:45 A.M. (Late) Divine Service. This year, children will not join their parents in church for worship at 10:45, but will proceed immediately with their teachers to their classrooms downstairs. On September 26<sup>th</sup>, the Sunday School staff will teach their classes outside beginning at 10:45, weather permitting. Preschool children are being invited this year to join the children of our congregation in Sunday School on Sunday mornings, and their parents are being welcomed to join us in worship as well.

**OUR ADULT BIBLE CLASS** will resume Sunday September 26<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 -10:30 and will open the year with a verse-by-verse study of the book of Jude, its context, and importance for our life of faith.

## **WORSHIP ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 26<sup>TH</sup>**

We will hold our regular 8:15 Divine Service inside the church on September 26<sup>th</sup>. Our Later 10:45 A.M. Divine Service will be held outside underneath a tent in our beautiful late-summer weather. Holy Communion will be celebrated at the late, outdoor service. We encourage everyone to come, especially those who have been more reluctant to worship inside the church and would prefer the outside air at this time. Chairs and a tent will be provided, and following our worship service, a picnic lunch will be served. Not only will this be a special service, but it will be a great way for us to witness our faith to the community as they see us gather for worship on the Lord's Day outside.

Regarding the Picnic Lunch, meat will be provided, but we are requesting that members bring pot-luck side dishes to be shared. To alleviate fears of passing illness, we will have the food served and placed on your plate for safety. We are looking forward to being together again for what will be our first fellowship activity since the beginning of the Covid epidemic in March of 2020. Rain or shine we will be able to worship under the tents outside, and if need be, we can move the picnic into our large auditorium downstairs and socially distance if our weather is not cooperating.

## **CONFIRMATION CLASSES**

Levels I and III Confirmation Classes resume their regular schedule on Tuesday evening, September 7, 2021. Classes will run from September 7<sup>th</sup> until October 12. Examination of our Level III Confirmand Will Scott will be October 12, 2021 at 7:00 P.M. Witness Sunday will be held Sunday, October 17<sup>th</sup> at the late Service, and The Rite of Confirmation will be held for Will on Sunday, October 24, 2021, also at the Late (10:45 A.M.) Service.

NOTE: The new year of confirmation instruction will begin on the first Tuesday of January 2022 after the New Year which will be January 4<sup>th</sup>. Parents who are interested in having their children take part in our Level I Confirmation class, please contact the church office. Students meet from January until May, break for the Summer and complete their class work from September through October. Those who successfully complete their course of study then are eligible to step up to Levels II and III. The class year begins each January and is completed each October. On January 4, 2022, Levels I and II will both be taught simultaneously from 6:30-7:30 each Tuesday evening. Mrs. Kyrstyn Sloan will teach the introductory Level I class, and Pastor Boelter the Level II Class. There will be no level III Confirmation Class offered in January of 2022 due to a lack of enrollment in 2020 due to the covid pandemic.

**WE WILL BEGIN**- to pray the Litany once more in our small chapel on Saturday mornings beginning October 9<sup>th</sup>. The litany is prayed on the second and fourth Saturdays of each month. The Service is approximately 20 minutes in length, and along with the prayers of the church, introduce us to the lessons that will be read the next day, helping us to prepare our minds and hearts for hearing the sermon on the next Lord's Day. We curtailed our praying of the litany during Covid-19, but we now believe it is safe for us to gather once more and pray this long-standing prayer of the church. Litany begins promptly at 9:00 A.M.

**OUR FALL LWML RALLY** will be held on Saturday, September 11, 2021 at Angelica Lutheran Church in Allen Park, MI. Registration begins at 9:30 A.M. All women of Christ the King are welcome to attend!
