Dear Friends in Christ,

In the next few weeks we will celebrate the death of Christ, and the joy of His resurrection.

On Easter Sunday evening, Jesus appeared to two disciples on the Road to Emmaus. The disciples did not recognize their crucified and risen Lord at this point, and He patiently listened to them as they poured out their hearts concerning all they had experienced since the Maundy Thursday evening. Luke records that Jesus opened their understanding to all that the prophets had foretold about Him.

Their hearts burned within them as they listened in amazement and began to further comprehend the fulfillment of the prophetic Word in the events they had witnessed concerning Jesus. As they drew near the village, Jesus indicated He was going to travel further, but being late in the day, the disciples **IMPLORED** Him to stay with them. He did, and as they sat down to eat, Jesus took bread, blessed it and broke it and gave it to them. In this act their eyes were opened and they recognized that their Lord and Savior was alive with them...just as He had promised!

You and I always need the Living Christ with us, for we too need Him to open our eyes by His Word so we can see Him and believe in Him as our powerful, living Savior! This is always true, but much more so as evening draws near for us. In the shadows of the night, we especially need Jesus' protection, for we are vulnerable to danger, and we need Him near! Night can also be a most lonely

time for us, a time when we especially need Jesus' companionship and friendship.

Truth be told, life is full of evenings, times in which the prayer of these two disciples: "Abide with us, for it is toward evening" is most fitting! There are many times in our lives when the skies grow dark, and if Jesus doesn't come to fill us with His presence, we can be left without comfort. It is also true that to every one of us will come a last evening... the evening of our death. Our home will grow very quiet, and our end will be near. That is another very special time of darkness when we need Jesus to abide with us. With Jesus near, we have a Friend who knows and has already walked the "valley of the shadow" on Calvary.

It is good to have Jesus near, because He is the One who has conquered death on Easter for each of us!

Jesus abided with his disciples physically after the Resurrection, but more importantly, the Living Lord came to abide with them in His Word. Jesus immediately vanished again out of their sight, but they were glad and comforted by His presence in His true Word! Our Living, Omnipresent Lord is certainly with us, though we cannot see Him.

But even more important is that He regularly comes to us and abides with us in the promises of His Word!

May this Easter evening prayer be on your lips this Eastertide, and in every time of your life! That Jesus abides with us in His Word and will always bring light and joy!

### **Lenten and Easter Worship**

Join us for our final Lenten Wednesday midweek services on Wednesday, April 3 and 10 at 11:15 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. We have been enjoying a sermon series entitled "The Gospel in 7 Words" this season, which has helped each of us ponder and be better prepared to share God's love for us in His Crucified and Risen Son Jesus. Being a Christian believer not only entails "believing with our heart," but likewise "confessing with our lips" (Romans 10:9-10). By hearing the passion narrative and pondering some of Scripture's greatest themes, we are able, by the Holy Spirit's power, to always "be prepared to give a reason for the hope that lies within our hearts (I Peter 3:15)." NOTE: *The starting time for our morning Maundy Thursday and Good Friday Services are 11:00 A.M., 15 minutes prior to the start of our regular Lenten Wednesday services. This advance of 15 minutes on these two days is due to the volume of Kroger customer traffic in our parking lot. Plan accordingly and come a few moments ahead of time to ensure accessible parking.*

NOTE: *Holy Communion is ONLY celebrated on Easter Sunday at the early (8:00 A.M.) Divine Service. Please recognize that the early Easter Service also begins 15 minutes ahead of our normal Early Service starting time of 8:15. This 15 minute advance assists our congregation in celebrating the Resurrection and in our ability to gather between the two services for our Easter Breakfast between 9:00 A.M. and 10:30 in our Large Auditorium downstairs. There will be NO Adult Bible Class held on Easter Sunday morning. Our Sunday adult Bible Class resumes in our conference room on Sunday morning, April 28<sup>th</sup>.*

### **Easter Breakfast**

Join us as we gather in fellowship for Easter Breakfast on Sunday, April 21<sup>st</sup> between our two services. Breakfast is served from 9 AM until 10:30 AM in our Large Auditorium. Either come and worship at our 8 AM Service and have breakfast, or come for breakfast first and join us in worship celebrating our Lord's Resurrection at our 10:45 A.M. Service. Come and bring your family and friends and enjoy the blessings of Easter morning with us!

**LWML Greater Detroit English District Zone Spring Rally at Christ the King Saturday, May 4th!**

Join us for a joyful morning filled with love, laughter, devotion, a servant event, music and lunch. Come and worship with us, and hear Elizabeth Parrish, DCE Intern and Sue Riske, serving Camp Restore at Mt. Calvary Lutheran, Detroit, who will speak and entertain us as we learn of the great mission work that is being accomplished here on Detroit's East Side. Participants are asked to bring a non-perishable food item for the food pantry here at Christ the King.

As part of LWML's outreach, women's health kits will be assembled to take to the LWML Convention in Alabama. Each congregation of our circuit/LWML Zone is contributing a health item for the kit, which will be given to homeless women in shelters which house, educate, and care for their medical needs. Many of these women are victims of sexual, physical and emotional abuse and abandonment and come to the shelters with literally nothing but the clothes on their back. They need much compassion, support, and mercy. Christ the King's role will be to gather brand new bath towels, into which washcloths, women's personal supplies and toiletries will be wrapped into bundles and made ready for those in need.

Our initial goal is to collect at least 32 large bath towels (we hope to collect even more!). Can you help? We will collect the towels in the Library in a box marked for this purpose near the fireplace.

**Sunday Morning Bible Class**

We have been studying the Heroes of the Faith this past winter. Sunday morning Bible Class meets every Sunday between the services at 9:30-10:30 A.M. Classes continue after Easter from April 28<sup>th</sup> and end May 19<sup>th</sup>, the weekend before Memorial Day Weekend which is May 26<sup>th</sup>. We will break during the summer months and will resume study next September 8<sup>th</sup>.

**Wednesday Morning Bible Class** meets every Wednesday at 10 A.M. This winter, we took a break from our study of the Book of Hebrews and enjoyed a study on what God's Word has to say regarding the issue of Immigration. *There will be NO Wednesday morning Bible Class during Holy Week on April 17<sup>th</sup> and April 24<sup>th</sup>.* The Wednesday morning Bible Class will resume May 1<sup>st</sup> and will continue until Wednesday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Wednesday before Memorial Day. Classes will break for the summer months and will resume September 11<sup>th</sup> after Rally Day.

**Preschool Sunday Remembered**

We had a wonderful Sunday morning on March 24<sup>th</sup> as we gathered for worship at our regular Divine Services, and as we held a special service for our Preschoolers and their parents and family members between our two services at 10:00 A.M. This abbreviated service was a blessing for our children and their parents, many of whom are not familiar with our ways of worship. The service was 30 minutes in length, just the right amount of time, and provided time for prayer, the children's singing, a concise message from God's Word, and an offering to our Lord. Approximately 230 parents and children attended this service, which culminated in a fellowship time downstairs in our Large Auditorium.

We thank all CtK members who came to support our preschoolers and our staff and to worship that morning. This change in worship was not only a blessing for our guests, but provided a blessed experience for our membership as well. Thank you to all who embraced this new worship schedule for Preschool Sunday and who participated!

### Confirmation Classes

Our Confirmation Program continues each Tuesday afternoon/evening here at CtK. Students will have no classes April 2nd which is Spring Break in the GPW School District. Classes resume April 9<sup>th</sup>, and then break again on April 16<sup>th</sup> for Holy Week. Classes again resume April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Level II Students finish their spring course of study on May 7<sup>th</sup> and then break for the summer.

Level III meets for class until Tuesday, May 21<sup>st</sup>. Summer assignments will be given to Level III students to prepare them for Witness Sunday, Confirmation Sunday, the writing of their essay, and preparation of their Confirmation banner.

### Elders' Corner *Paul Nuechterlein*

#### "Did You Really Say That?"

"Church is boring." "I believe that I'm the only one who does the work around here." "I wish that the church services were more entertaining." "I'm not getting anything out of worship."

Haven't we all, at times, been bored in church, or thought that we are not appreciated by our church, or even left the service feeling empty inside? The only place to lay that blame is on ourselves, because it shows our lack of love for our Lord.

Many cynics wanted Jesus to entertain them to show them that He was from God. Even in His own town, the leaders of the synagogue wanted to see His miracles done for them so that they might believe that He was truly a prophet that could offer them direction. Jesus was rejected by His own people.

When we enter church, we enter as sinners, allowed only to approach the altar of the Almighty God with a penitent heart.

As Pastor said in last week's service, we didn't come into the ark to smell the animals or to enjoy our comfort, but only to experience and recognize God's ultimate love and grace and salvation.

When people asked Jesus what the most important commandment given to them would be. He answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and with all your mind". Matthew 22:37, Luke 10:27 Deuteronomy 6, 4-7 Mark 12 30-31

Where does, "I'm not getting anything out of worship," align with this command? We should instead be thanking God for His ultimate sacrifice.

"And this shall be a sign unto you. Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace, good will toward men.'" Luke 2:13

Where does, "I wish that the services were more entertaining," stand up against all of the angels' praise to God? The angels see God very clearly.

By confessing these things, we are prepared to receive the Good News of Jesus Christ. Because of His love for us, Christ freely offered Himself up on the cross, so that through His perfect sacrifice, our sins of thought, word, and deed would be removed.

Since we are now "dead to sin and alive in Jesus," we leave worship overflowing with our Father's love and gladly serve Him and want to worship Him. We now worship Him as the Almighty God.

**Finding Contentment in Jesus**

In the Apostle Paul's letter to the people in Philippi, he wrote, *"I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty."* (Philippians 4:11-12 NIV) We are told by Paul that contentment is a state of mind that is not dependent upon external circumstances. True contentment comes from knowing that God is in control and that He will provide for us.

As God's people, we need to be aware that the society in which we live is trying hard to make us discontent. Advertisements suggest that we can't be content without expensive houses, new cars, exotic vacations, big investments, and the latest in clothes. Our culture tries to make us believe that happiness and contentment are within our reach if we acquire just a few more things.

Our contentment should not be based on the size of our incomes or on our net worth. It has nothing to do with the size of our houses or year of our cars. Contentment can't be bought at a department store or travel agency. Real contentment is not related to outward circumstances.

For many, acquiring money can become a preoccupation and an obsession. We can become slaves to wealth. Greed will not allow contentment, because it will always urge us to acquire more. No matter how we try, we cannot be satisfied by worldly things. The love of money can potentially possess a person's life like no other emotion can. Jesus spoke about the futility of greed in Matthew 16:26 when He asked, *"For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and forfeits his soul?"* The things we possess will contribute only to fleeting happiness, not an enduring peace and contentment.

When we place our security in money, pride, self-centeredness, and self-sufficiency take over as we make ourselves god, trusting in ourselves rather than God to provide. We become like the Rich Fool, who gave himself credit for his success and desired even more. (Luke 16:13-21) We can push God out of our lives.

Contentment comes from dependence on the Lord. When God is our security, we can be content. The Apostle Paul knew both the secret of contentment and how to receive it. Paul told the Philippians and us, *"I can do all things through Him Who strengthens me."* (Philippians 4:13) Without Christ, we will never achieve contentment. A relationship with Christ will redirect our focus from transient earthly pleasures to things of eternal significance. Keeping our eyes on *"the prize"* (Philippians 3:14) will bring about gratitude in our hearts for what we have rather than desiring what we don't have.

We are making great progress on our 1-1-1 Mission project! We are the 55<sup>th</sup> congregation in the English District to raise funds for the establishment of new congregations in the English District. 1-1-1 stands for \$1.00/per 1 week/per every 1 person.
